The Boundaries are Bloomfield Village Subdivision Number 5, the Township Well Site, Westchester Village Subdivision Number 2 and proposed Westchester Village Subdivision Number 3 located on Cranbrook Road on the East; Supervisor's Plat of Berkshire Forest Subdivision and proposed Westchester Village Subdivision Number 4 on the South; and Lahser Road on the West.
