S'field Millage Vote Deserves 'Yes' Vote

Southfield voters will have a chance Monday to decide whether or not they want to tax themselves an additional \$1.40 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation (abut \$7 on a home assessed at \$5,000) so that township governmental services may keep pace with the increased demands and needs of a growing township.

More than 200 residents who attended the annual township meeting in April supported the township board's contention that this extra \$115,730 was needed to adequately service an increasing population in an era of ever-increasing prices.

THIS ADDITIONAL money would provide citizens with five additional policemen, three more firemen, a badly-needed dog catcher and some other services which township officials feel must be provided to satisfy residents' demands.

Township employees, like everyone else, want—and deserve—a pay raise. This, however, is only a slight part of the cut-
