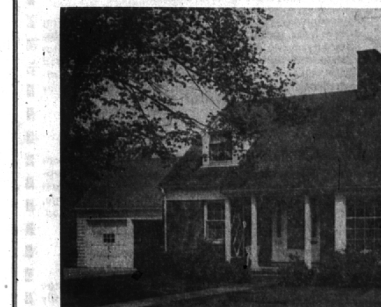

that should arise and that the ordinance should have an immediate vote, avoiding any more debate.

William King, former Birmingham Farms village president, stated he felt that if it should become necessary to defend the zoning law in court, the expense could be covered by voluntary contributions from Farms residents.

"Although it was the general opinion that the board of appeals could decide what Riem termed 'cases of hardship,' one amendment changing a property classification was pushed through at the last minute. The change affects 73 acres owned by Carmen Adams of Detroit. The property, on which Adams proposes a possible 40-home development, was rezoned to allow lots with a minimum of 30,000 square feet.
