Sports In Brief

Birmingham track team, unbeaten in 27 consecutive dual track meets covering a period of four years, will end the season Saturday afternoon in a relay meet at U. of D. . . The meet could turn into a spectacular if Tom Segal, disabled for almost the entire track season in an attempt to pole vault with Bill MacFarlen, state pole vaulting champion. Segal also cleared over 12 feet before being disabled for the majority of the season because of a disc ailment in his back.

SEGAL WILL determine if he is in shape by practicing a couple of vaults today in the league meet at Hazel Park. . . If he is in shape, the Birmingham pole vault relay team Saturday could set a record that could well last for more than fifty years. . . Tom Estes and Arnold Isactis are two Birmingham ballplayers that have been invited to come down to Briggs Stadium June 20 and 27 for a two-day workout with the Tiger scouts and coaches in connection with possible future professional baseball playing.

ESTES CAME to Birmingham from East Lansing where he was named All Conference and All-Twin Valley Quarterback in football, or the State Championship Class E East Lansing team. . . He was honorable mention for honors as All-State quarterback, but Estes says that baseball is his game, that he plays football and basketball only to keep himself in shape for the diamond.

ISSETTE IS an All-American curling champion and the youngest "skip" (director) of any curling team in America. . . Babe Ruth World Series management is currently faced with the problem of raising \$10,000 to defray some of the expenses of the Babe Ruth World Series, to be held in Michigan this year at Ann Arbor's Ferry Field. . . One of the methods they will use is sale of admission tickets to the World Series, at \$1 each.

AL. BATES, chairman of the Babe Ruth World Series Committee has estimated a probable attendance during the four-day series of approximately 35,000 persons.

Wolfe and George of Port Huron were low for the Big Red with 82. Birmingham's total of 308 marked the fourth time this season that the Maples have been under 310, something which no other Birmingham golf team has ever done.

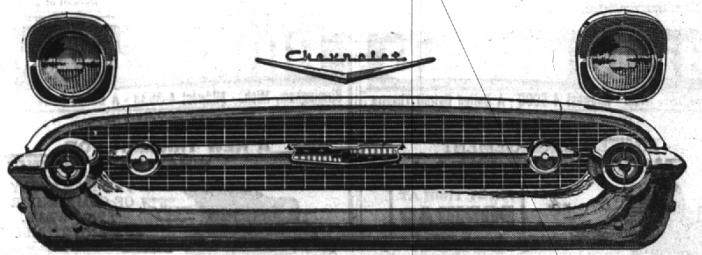
Stanton Swimming Coach in Colorado
