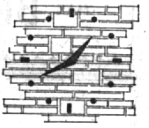

NOW ALL YE CRABS

Here are words of wisdom about CRABGRASS control. When you read this it will be the 9th or 10th of May... an ideal time to take the first step to place your crabgrass under your control. There is a product called CHLORDANE which is used to control soil insects such as grubs, and webworms etc. It also has the ability when spread on the soil surface to KILL THE CRABGRASS SEEDLINGS AS THEY GERMINATE. It should be sprayed on the ground (the soil) at the rate of ONE PINT to 2,000 square feet before any seeds germinate... an event occurring usually near the end of May. (If you are later than this don't despair because it will take care of many ungerminated seeds in June, July or even August.)

The degree of control will depend a lot on the accuracy with which you distribute the material. For ease of distribution we recommend the LIQUID form of 48% CHLORDANE. Now don't be stupid about this. You can't be 100% perfect and some plants will appear. But we believe that with an honest effort on your part the crabgrass problem can be a minor one.

CHICKWEED has become almost more of a problem than crabgrass. Two products are recommended for its control in the next couple of weeks. (There is no use to kill it in late June or July or August because you won't have much luck in getting grass going in the bare spots.) Do it now or in September.

1. C. W. K. kills chickweed... But it must be applied accurately... Such as 1 oz. to 2 gals. of water to 250 sq. ft. Put it on stronger and you lose the grass also... weaker and it does no good.
2. WEED-B-GON used at the rate of 3 teaspoonfuls to a gallon of water and sprayed on the clumps should kill them; If they brown up but don't quite die give them another dose in a week.
