

'Vacation in N.Y.' Is Recital Theme For Dance Pupils

"Vacation in New York" will be the theme of a dance recital presented at 8 p.m. May 17 by pupils of Sue Roseberry's school, in Cranbrook's little gymnasium. Ballet, character, pantomime and spanish numbers will be included.

Mary Pew of Wing Lake and Quana Winchell of Franklin will play the parts of the vacationers, with the opening scene on the sidewalks of New York. They'll register at the Plaza hotel, where "Eloise," played by Rutaine Hacker, in pantomime, will enter the scene.

SUCCESSIVE numbers will include a visit to a ballet class where four and five year old ballerinas will perform, and a tour of an aquarium, featuring tropical fish. Entering a Spanish cafe, the tourists will view a spanish dance routine by the pupils of the Theodore J. Smith school in Detroit, including Sue Roseberry.

Dancers in costumes depicting five different countries will perform when the vacationers stop at the United Nations. A tour through central park will bring in several dance numbers and the recital will conclude when the two travelers spend an evening at the ballet.

THE 42 youngsters in the show study under 17-year-old Sue Roseberry, a junior at Birmingham high school who has been teaching for four years. She conducts her classes at the home of her parents, the Harold A. Roseberrys of Wellington road, Franklin.

Currently a pupil of Theodore J. Smith, Sue will study this summer at the Jacob's Pillow school in Massachusetts. She has been taking lessons for eleven years.

To Survey Needs For Post-High School Education

An extensive survey will be started about May 15 in Oakland and Macomb counties by Michigan State University in cooperation with area school systems to determine the needs for post-high-school education.

Initial plans for the survey are announced by school officials of the two counties and by MSU administrators. Exploratory planning sessions began several months ago and are being stepped up now to launch the survey in about two weeks.

The questionnaire survey among children, parents and other adults and area teachers and educators will have two objectives:

1. To survey interest of area residents for education beyond high school.
2. To determine area demands for various courses which might be offered at the projected MSU branch at the Meadowbrook Farms estate.

MSU OFFICIALS explain that the survey will be instrumental in analyzing the needs of the area and in planning for courses in such fields as engineering, business and public service, education, and others.

The willingness of area school officials and leaders in other fields to cooperate in the planning for the proposed branch is lauded by Michigan State leaders.

Dr. John A. Hannah, president of MSU, has stated, "The willing cooperation of so many Oakland and Macomb citizens enables MSU to go ahead with the planning, secure in the knowledge that we have the best of advice and guidance in making the new institution of maximum usefulness in the area it is intended to serve."

FULL INFORMATION about the questionnaire will be announced soon, report MSU leaders and area school officials.

The proposed branch of Michigan State at the Meadowbrook Farm will open in the fall of 1959, according to the present time schedule. Site studies are underway and the construction contract for the first building is expected to be let within the next year.

The gift of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson of their Meadowbrook estate and a \$2,000,000 cash endow-

ment to establish a branch was accepted in January by the governing board of Michigan State. Various advisory committees of area leaders have been selected to guide in the development of the plans.
