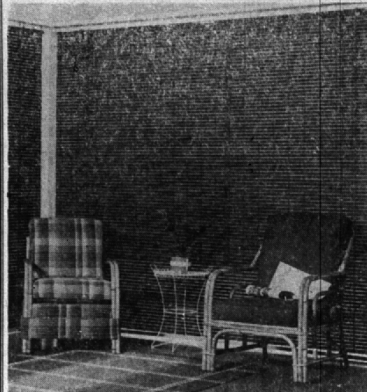
Request was tabled until the June meeting by board of appeals so neighboring property owners could be advised of the zone switch from residential to commercial.

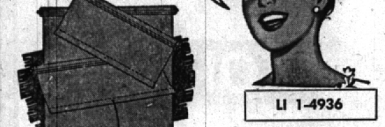
