At last week's meeting an executive committee was appointed to formulate a constitution, with valuable help given by advisors, Mr. Montie and Mr. Radd.

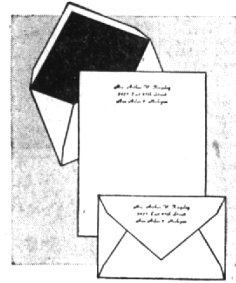

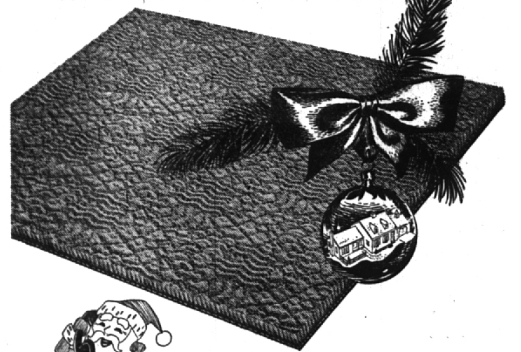
