Seek More Money For Street Repairs

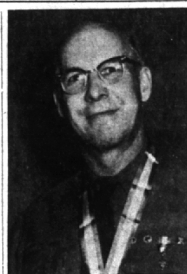
SOUTHFIELD—Ben Fyke & Sons, Inc. have asked the township board to pay an additional \$1,000 to repair North Carolina street.

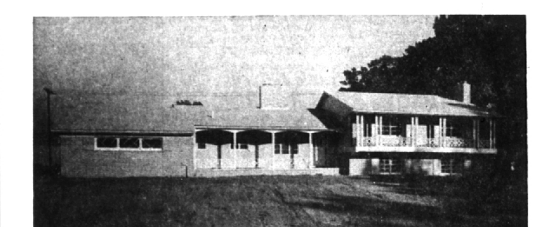

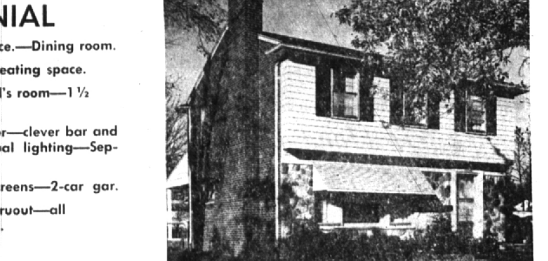
