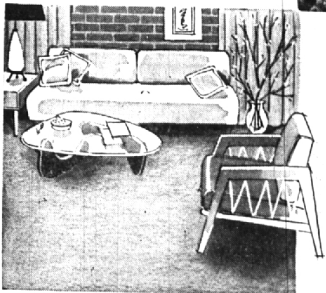
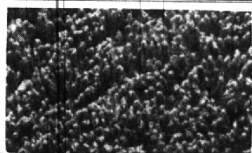

**Andover Blacktop
A Possibility,
School Supt. Says**

Blacktopping for chuck-holed
Andover road in front of Bloom-
field Hills high school is being
studied under a state pro-
gram of matching state road mon-
ey with township funds. Supt. Eu-
gene L. Johnson reported to Bloom-
field Hills board of education Tues-
day.

Township Supervisor Arno Hulet
had notified him, Johnson said, that
\$4,500 is available in additional
state road money if the township
can match it by Jan. 1.

Since church, school and town-
ship residents all use the road, one
of the worst in the township, Hulet
said, he would give first approval
to it if funds could be raised by
the school and adjacent subdivi-
sion.

HE POINTED OUT that the
state program provides an oppor-
tunity to have the blacktopping
done at half the usual cost.

A similar sum, Hulet stated, will
be available next year, according
to a letter the township had re-
ceived from Paul Van Roekel,
county highway engineer. Accord-
ing to Van Roekel, the funds are
made available through two sup-
plemental acts to the 1951 road
act passed this year.

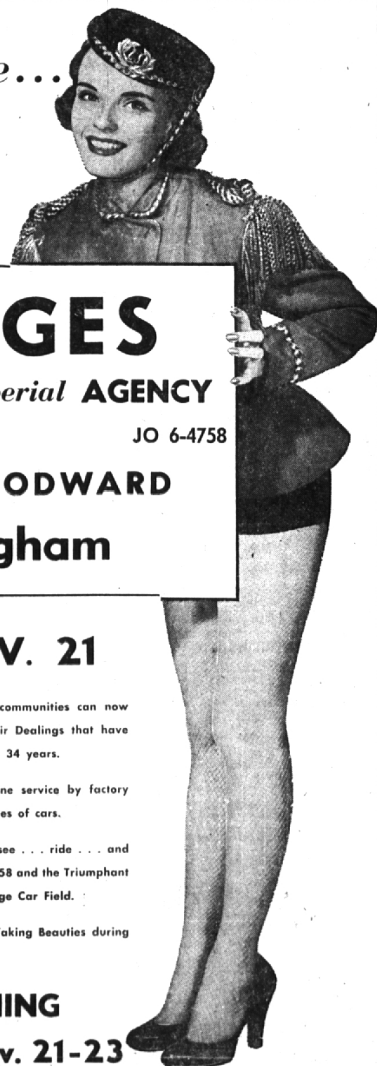
