WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT:

• Operation S-H-R-I-N-K

Q. Is life shortened by being overweight? If fat people lose weight will they live longer?
A. A pat yes or no answer can't be given to these questions but nature does put a pretty high price tag on fat.

Q. Are fat people more likely to have diabetes than people of normal weight?
A. Diabetes occurs more often in fat people than in those of normal weight but this does not mean that diabetes is always the punishment for obesity. The tendency to develop diabetes is often inherited. If you have inherited this tendency then piling up weight certainly won't help matters.

Q. Can fat people lose weight too fast?
A. Yes. As one doctor said, it takes time to put on fat and it should take not much less time to lose it. Dieting seems so simple and harmless that far too many people become do-it-yourself weight reducers. They read an article in a magazine and off they go on another food fad. The "Rockefeller Diet" is an example. A doctor who is a member of the Rockefeller Institute where low-protein and other diets were used in experiments said that such diets are dangerous when not supervised by a physician. He offers this sound advice: "Anyone desiring to use any reducing diet is urged to consult his family doctor."

Q. Do fat children always become overweight adults?
A. Not always but the odds seem to be stacked in favor of continued obesity. Material in MEDICAL MIRROR is based on various scientific publications and does not necessarily reflect the opinion of all doctors. The diagnosis and treatment of disease requires skill and knowledge which only a physician can apply by personally attending the patients said that such diets are dangerous when not supervised by a physician.
