Former Resident Dies Out West

Mrs. W. Nelson Whittemore (Marjorie Miller) formerly of Opdyke road, Bloomfield Hills, died Nov. 18 in Santa Barbara, Calif. She lived on the land now occupied by St. Hugo of the Hills, which was built in 1927.
 Her husband, the late Mr. Whittemore, who died early this year, raised dahlias and won many prizes. He also had a remarkable collection of stones, which he gave to the Cranbrook Museum.
 Mrs. Whittemore was a member of St. James Episcopal church in Birmingham and was active in church activities in Santa Barbara. She was a community minded woman.

MRS. WHITTEMORE formed and developed a private center for elderly people in Santa Barbara called The Senior Center. In the near future, a second Senior Center will be named after Mrs. Whittemore.
 Her mother, the late Susan Miller, was one of the original motiva-

tors in the Birmingham Community House. Its auditorium was named after her.
 She is survived by a daughter, Miss Susan Blanche Whittemore of Detroit.

ARCHILLE TRABUCCI, 65, father of Valentino of Humphrey, Birmingham, died Friday at William Beaumont hospital after a short illness. He lived in Berkeley.

MRS. LIDA WILSON ILETT, 87, of 1255 Eaton road, Birmingham, died Tuesday at the Arnold Home in Detroit after a short illness. Born in Fainesville, Ohio, Sept. 20, 1870, she came to Birmingham two years ago, coming from Los Angeles, Calif.
 She was past president of the Federation of Women's clubs and the founder of the Lighthouse for the Blind in Chicago.
 She is survived by two sons, Edward W. of Birmingham and Wil-

lard E. of Van Nuys, Calif.; also one granddaughter, Gretchen Ann Newell, of Oakland, Birmingham, with the Rev. Fletcher Plant officiating.

Interceptor Bonds Up for Sale Soon

Harold K. Schone, Oakland county department of public works director, said this week the bonds for the Evergreen sewage disposal system will go on sale in March or April of next year.

Schone said that contracts for the project probably would be let in April, 1958, with the construction scheduled to be completed by Jan., 1959.

Up to now, Schone said, "we have completed construction plans for the system from 14 Mile road south to enter into the City of Detroit system for treatment and these plans will be submitted to the state department of health this week."

He added that the construction completion date "means it will be approximately 12 to 14 months before there will be an outlet to the Acacia drain into the Evergreen interceptor."

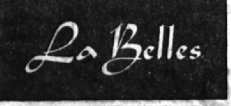
