Students Display Talents In Variety Show

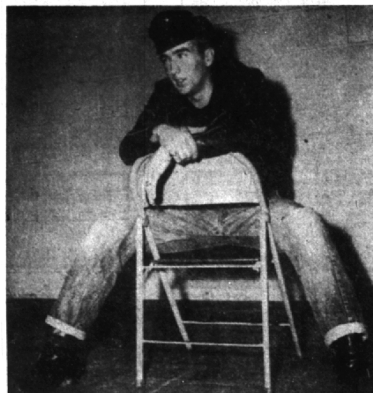

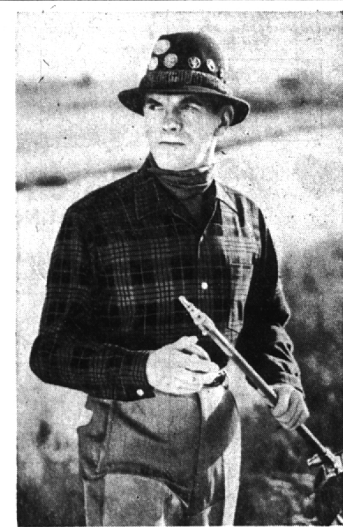
