Southfield PTA Council To Discuss New Program On Delinquency Prevention

A plan for the prevention of delinquency by the organization of a youth family protection committee will be discussed by James W. Hunt, director of children's services of Oakland county, at the Southfield area council PTA meeting to be held at Southfield high school, Hazel at Ten Mile, Dec. 3, at 8 p.m.

Program is an outgrowth of the Oakland County PTA area council presidents, with the Honorable Arthur E. Moore, judge of the Oakland County juvenile court.

JUDGE MOORE explained in detail his juvenile protection plan whereby many cases involving young people will be handled by a citizen's committee, thus eliminating the need to bring them before a court.

Because the objects of PTA concern the welfare and care of children and youth, Judge Moore has asked the PTA to sponsor his juvenile protection plan in Oakland County.

A SIMILAR program has been in operation in Hazel Park since 1953, and is working with a great deal of success.

Clarence Reid, president of the Lederle PTA, and Mrs. Harold Mistelet, vice president of the Southfield area council PTA, visited a meeting in Hazel Park to see the committee in action and observe its plan of operation. There will be a brief report of this visit.

PHILIP LaVIGNE, chief of police for Southfield, will give a report of the plan from the point of view of the police force, while Mrs. Edith Blake, consultant on special education for Southfield schools, will report on the plan from the educator's point of view.

Leslie Symond, chairman of the juvenile protection committee for Southfield area council PTA, will lead the discussion following Hunt's address.

James Hunt and Mrs. Charles L. Curtis, president of the Southfield area council, extend an invitation to all civic groups interested in finding out more about juvenile protection to plan to attend the Dec. 3 meeting.
