



ORDER OF MICHIGAN CONSERVATION COMMISSION REGULATING FISHING IN THE GREAT TRUMP PONDS
 The Conservation Commission, by authority of Act 219, P. A. 1955, as amended, hereby orders that for five years from January 1st, 1956, it shall be unlawful to hunt or fish in said ponds, except as hereinafter provided, to fish in said ponds except as provided in Section 19, T. N. R. 11 E. and Section 24, Section 4, T. N. R. E. and Section 24, Section 4, T. N. R. E. and Section 24, State Park Hearing Post Nos. 1 and 2, Section 4, T. N. R. E. of Grand County. Fishing shall be lawful during the statutory trout season.
 2. Fishing shall be limited to the period from one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset.
 3. Artificial flies only may be used. For the purpose of these regulations, the term "artificial fly" shall be defined as any form of either a "dry fly" or a "wet fly" as ordinarily used in fishing for trout and which shall not have attached thereon or used in connection therewith any type of fishing lure of whatever kind or description.
 4. No boat or raft shall be placed or used on the ponds.
 5. The daily limit shall be two trout.
