and is one of the few tall men in this season's Colt squad. Figley, who will play either guard or forward, stands 5-11. One other Troy cager—Forward Don Harned—saw some varsity action toward the end of the season. The 5-8 junior will probably hold down a starting guard berth. Beyond those three, just who'll

be starting for Troy is still very in doubt. Goodwin admits he will have to do a lot of shifting before the right combination is found. Bill Hanson and Sandy Morgan, a pair of 6-foot senior forwards, may help fill the gap. Hanson, Goodwin reports, probably would have been a regular last season except for illness which sidelined the youth for the season a few days after practice opened.

**TWO SOPHOMORES**—Rick McKinnon and Jim DePauw—are also being eyed for heavy duty. McKinnon is a 5-8 guard and DePauw a 5-11 forward. Rod Harris, a 6-foot 4-inch junior center, will add some height to the Troy squad. Goodwin adds he has several good shots among non-letter-winning candidates, but that the Troy bench will be weak. He feels the outlook for the first few games, until some of the newcomers get experience, is dim.

## Troy Grid Quartet Earn Oakland 'B' All-League Berths

Four standout Troy high footballers have been named to the 22-player Oakland 'B' conference all-league team, selected Nov. 18 at a meeting of coaches of the six member schools.  
Placed on the honor squad are allocated on the basis of a team's place in the final standings. The conference titlist, Lake Orion, captured six positions, while runner-up Clawson was awarded five berths.  
Troy, after winning five straight, including two loop battles, slipped to third in the Oakland 'B' standings when it lost two of its final league matches and tied the third.  
COLT STARN awarded all-league honors are Backs Wayne Figley and Dave Stokes, Tackle Rick Aebel and Guard Leo Valko.  
Figley, quarterback for Coach Joe Bechard's Troy squad, scored seven touchdowns in eight games. Stokes, junior halfback, tallied 37 points for the Colts.  
Fitzgerald, which finished fourth, won three honor posts, while two went to fifth-place Madison and one to last-place Avondale.  
LAKE ORION end Jim Drake was named the league's most outstanding player.  
Troy also had two prepsters—Bill Jennings and Ben Burkland—among the 11 players given honorable mention.
