Color Markers For Motorists At Kensington

Fall color tour markers are in place now at Kensington Metropolitan Park near New Hudson and free maps of the 28-mile route are available at the park. Park authorities said they expected peak color for some of the finest autumn scenery in southeastern Michigan for the weekend of Oct. 12-13.

Fall foliage is also to be enjoyed in other parks of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority—Lower Huron Metropolitan Park near Belleville where there are two labeled hiking trails, Dexter Huron Metropolitan Park near Ann Arbor, Marshbank Metropolitan Park near Pontiac, and at Metropolitan Beach on Lake St. Clair near Mt. Clemens.

THE 550-ACRE beach-park on Lake St. Clair will continue roller skating from 1 to 10 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday, and facilities for special parties every day of the week through Nov. 3, and the golf course will be open daily from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. through Oct. 30.

The food bar is open weekends from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. and on weekdays when weather indicates. Motorists and board-walk strollers comment on yellow birches and willows and the vivid scarlet of sumac, all of which have given to good signs since the park opened six years ago.

The Kensington motor tour begins at the park's east entrance on Grand River (U.S. 16) and takes less than an hour and a half of driving time.

The trip centers about the 4,500 park, traversing the most scenic of the park drives through hilly, wooded land, passing several lakes. It leaves the park temporarily for a 16-mile drive through the country-side, skirting the General Motors Proving Ground, and returns for another loop around Kent Lake and over Metropolitan Parkway to the east exit on U.S. 16.

1200-acre Kent Lake are obtained, particularly from high Buno Overlook where telescopes are installed. Also to be seen are tiny Lane Lake and Whitewing Lake where a gravel bar brings wildfowl within easy seeing distance. A wide variety of local and migratory ducks and Canadian geese may be seen at close range in the park.

The side-wheeler excursion boat, "Island Queen" will continue hourly runs on Kent Lake on pleasant October Sundays. The boat rental dock will be open weekends weather permitting and free launching ramps will continue open to owners of private boats until the end of the season.

Scarlet and gilt predominate in the park's autumn coloring, often reflected in the lake waters, especially in island-studded Kent Lake. Sugar maples, aspen and hickory lend gold to the picture. Red maple, red dogwood, Virginia creeper and quantities of sumac are the red accent. Ash trees are purple as is the grey dogwood with clusters of white berries contrast-

ing with purple foliage. Sassafras is bronze.

OPEN FIELDS are masses of golden red and purple asters. Three kinds of sumac may be seen: the staghorn with fiery cones; the smooth, which is red and aromatic; and the poison sumac, brightest of all, like a brush fire in swampy areas.

There are seven labeled hiking trails in the park, with trees, shrubs and other interesting botanical and geological features marked. Detailed descriptions are furnished free.
