

How to make sure you get the right number

Look it up. Be sure you look up the right number in your directory. It's a good idea to keep the number in front of you as you dial.

Dial the complete number. Be sure you dial the first two letters and all five numerals. For example, to call Riverside 2-5199, first dial the letters R and I, and then the numerals 2, 5, 1, 9, 9.
