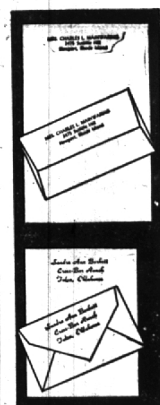

SO Symphony Opens Season

Mischa Kottler, renowned pianist of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, was guest soloist for the South Oakland Symphony Orchestra's first subscription concert of the season Wednesday evening. Henri Nosen conducted the concert at the Royal Oak Dunder high school auditorium.

Beethoven's 4th Piano Concerto was played by Mr. Kottler. The orchestra presented a "well-rounded" program including Richard Strauss' "Serenade for Wind Instruments," and Henry Cowell's "Hymn and Purgative Tune," the premier performance of which was under Henri Nosen's baton in New York City with the NBC Symphony Orchestra in 1945.

The October 9th concert was the first of five subscription concerts to be played by the South Oakland Symphony Orchestra during the 1957-58 season.

Others will feature as soloists such artists as Paul Olefsky, principal cellist of the Detroit Symphony, tenor Charles Taylor, and the winner of last year's South Oakland Symphony talent contest, Miss Margaret Connell.

Admission to all concerts, (except the January 28th concert) will be by membership card only.
