There are 370 students attending classes at Cranbrook this year, an enrollment which, for the seventh consecutive year, has risen higher than in any previous year. 128 new students arrived at Cranbrook, the majority of whom are members of the lower grades. Of the new boys, the boarders greatly outnumber the day students, making up a total enrollment this year of 200 boarding boys and 170 day students.

This year, five new sons of alumni have entered Cranbrook bringing the total of alumni sons to 24. They are freshmen Tom Booth and James Bragaw and first formers Pierce Getzinger, William Hunt, and John Leighton. Several brothers of present students and of graduates also have enrolled for the first time.

Mr. Floyd W. Bunt, a longtime Cranbrook master, will take over as housemaster of Towers this year. He will replace Mr. Bruce Coulter who will devote his time out of the classroom to directing the guidance program.

Mr. Bunt was born in Canada and educated at the University of Toronto and the Ontario agricultural college, where he received bachelor's degrees in science and agriculture. Later he was awarded an M.A. from Wayne University in Detroit. He came to Cranbrook in 1944 and since then has taught chemistry and automobiles and taken part in many other endeavors around Cranbrook. He is now director of the work program at Cranbrook and the Cranbrook foundation's director of civil defense. He is head of Cranbrook's rifle program and a pistol instructor for police in the Birmingham-Bloomfield Hills area.

On Monday of this week the team played Bloomfield Hills high school. The first team scored a 3 to 0 victory and the second team won 7 to 0.



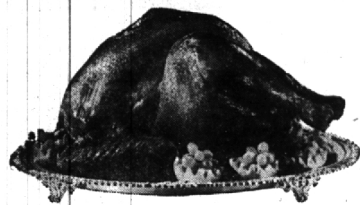
