He lived in Troy in his early life and moved to Buffalo having farmed there until his retirement four years ago.

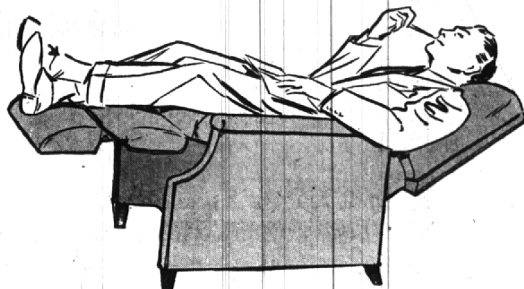
