RESOLUTION NO. 57-568

The following Resolution was offered by Commissioner Lowe, and seconded by Commissioner Gray.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the maps and plans showing the improvements hereinafter described and the location thereof, together with the estimates of cost thereof, are hereby approved and adopted and are ordered filed with the City Clerk for public examination, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Commission hereby determines to make the public improvements which shall consist of the paving with Portland cement concrete that portion of Derby Road extending from Adams Avenue east to the Grand Trunk Railroad Viaduct and the construction of necessary drainage and appurtenances, such pavement to be of a width of 37 feet and to include integral concrete curb and gutter, which improvements will benefit the lands and premises so indicated below, to-wit:

Birmingham Estates No. 2, Lot Nos. 295 through 300, Lot 301, and Lots 303 through 307.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said improvement shall be assessed as a Special Assessment District and assessments shall be levied according to benefits against the properties within said district, which lands and premises are hereby declared to be specially benefitted thereby.

Provided, however, that there shall be assumed and paid by the City that portion of the cost of such improvement which is assessed to public lands owned by a governmental unit not liable for the payment of Special Assessments unless such governmental unit agrees to pay the same as authorized by law, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Commission shall meet in the City Hall in October 28, 1957, at 7:30 P.M., to hear and consider any objections to said public improvement and to the Special Assessment District created hereby and the City Clerk shall cause notice thereof to be published once in The Birmingham Eccentric, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Troy at least five (5) days prior to said meeting.
