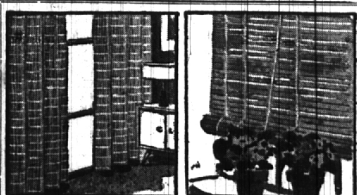

Parents Announce Daughter's Troth

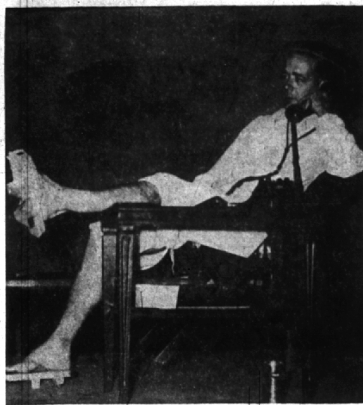

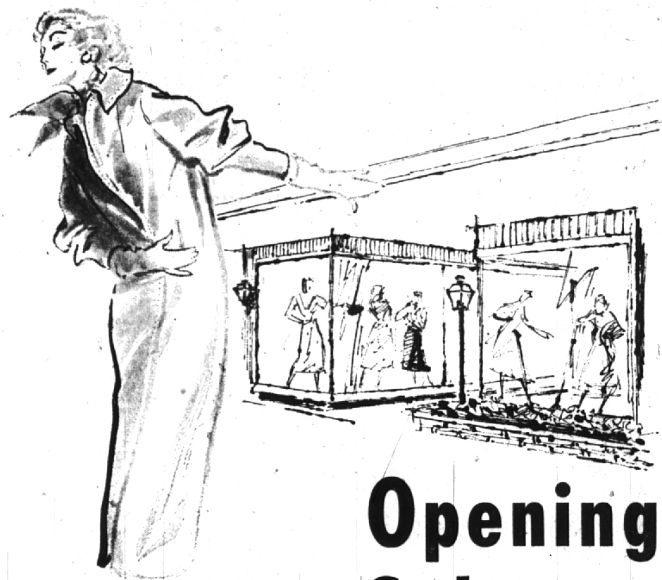
