Higgins emphasizes, however, that, in his opinion, there is a good chance the federal law may be changed, enabling the proposed turnpike to become eligible for federal aid.

"I am inclined to believe that no new US 10 or freeway is included in Mackie's five-year program," said Higgins.

According to the Turnpike Chairman, he will be able to say next week whether he will be able to sell bonds for construction of the turnpike.
