## Students Prepare For Field Day Oct. 16 at BHS

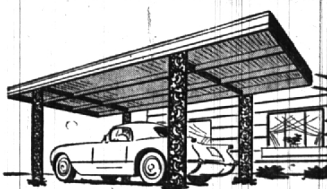

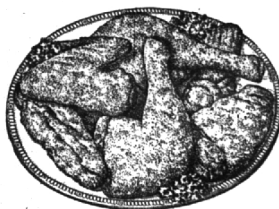
