**Forum to Discuss College Programs**

Parents of Birmingham high school seniors will study—not their ABC's, but their SQT's, NROTC's and DIO's—Oct. 8, at 8 p.m. in the little theatre at the high school, when Birmingham high school PTA holds the first of a series of October grade-level meetings.

The approaching date when college applications must be in the mail, or other plans must be made by seniors, makes all this scrambled alphabet of interest to them and their sons and daughters. SQT are scholarship qualifying tests, soon to be given to seniors. NROTC is, of course, naval reserve officers training corps. DIO is defense information orientation.

A FORUM LED BY Ross A. Wagner, principal, and made up of senior and student advisors, members of the faculty and of the student congress, will discuss the requirements and possibilities of these programs and will also explain all steps in sending in college applications, taking college board exams and some last-minute advice on choice of colleges.
