Mrs. W. J. McCarthy, of Dartmoor road, west Bloomfield, chairman of the Family Life Extension for Oakland County Extension Service, has prepared an exhibit at Baldwin public library starting today which will show the books and pamphlets recommended by Mr. Ard.

A MEMBER of the Graefield home demonstration unit, Mrs. McCarthy presented the material to her group on Wednesday.

Cooperative extension service is an out of school educational program; Oakland county has a three-fold program in agriculture, home economics and youth work.
