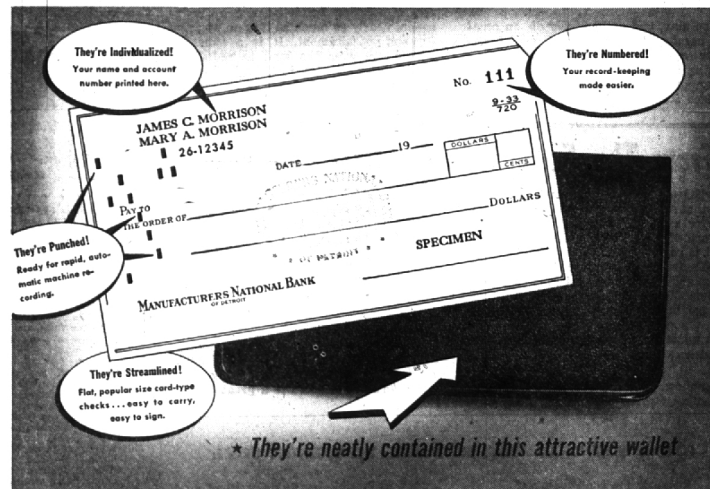
Luncheon for 381
