# For Southfield Ask Bloomfield Millage In S'field High Additions Vote Approval Monday Favored

Monday Bloomfield township voters are being asked to approve a one-mill tax increase over 20 years to assure buyers deformed township will, as a community, put its faith and credit behind the bond sale.

According to Supervisor Arno I. Hulet, this does not mean that the millage, if voted, will be spent, or even collected. Hulet has stated that tap-in charges collected in the past three years at the rate of \$200 a tap-in on new houses, have brought in \$200,000.
