Huron Water Survey Handed To Authority

Oakland county's present and future water needs can be solved by running a pipeline from Lake Huron to connect with the present Southeastern Oakland county water system, according to Bechtel Corp. of San Francisco.

The corporation recently made a \$116,000 study of the project and recommended construction of the eight-foot in diameter pipeline in a report to the Southeastern Michigan water authority.

The authority has three members each from Oakland and Macomb counties with Mayor Howard K.

Kelley of Royal Oak as chairman.

THE REPORT recommended that the pipeline be built on Lake Huron north of Port Huron with the entire project to be completed in three stages.

First stage would be finished by 1960 and would supply 100 million gallons daily, although ultimate capacity would range between 340 and 350 million gallons a day. The second and final stages would see the construction of reservoirs and other facilities.

are estimated at \$94,000,000 and would be paid for by the communities subscribing to the service whose ceiling price would be \$125 per thousand cubic feet.

THE PIPELINE would meet the water needs of both Oakland and Macomb counties as well as provide a standby supply for the Detroit area.

At present South Oakland county buys up to 35 million gallons of water daily from the Detroit system.
