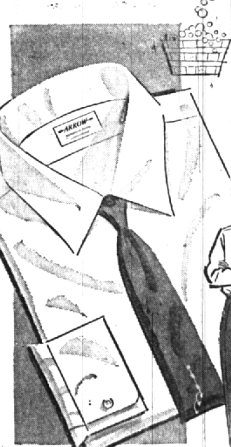

## Repainting Marks End Of Post's First Year

A complete repainting, inside and out, marked the end this fall of the first year of activity at the Birmingham Ground Observer Corps post on E. Maple.

Mrs. Ellen Ives, 113 Columbia, post supervisor, and Mrs. Germaine Nathan, chief observer, directed the renovation work. Post officers turned out with paint brushes recently for the job.

Covering south Oakland county the post is one of 30,000 in the country assisting radar installations in spotting aircraft and reporting spotings to the nearest filter center.

This action can activate air force planes or Nike missiles at 40 seconds' notice.

THE POST is also valuable in spotting tornadoes and locating lost aircraft.

All corps members are volunteers who are without pay two hours a week.

Corps members work for the air force in support of radar defenses as well as being part of a civil defense team.

More volunteers are sought, and anyone interested can contact Mrs. Ives.

The Birmingham post, with workers also coming from Clawson, Ferndale, Franklin, Royal Oak and Troy, is manned 60 per cent of the time, although the goal is a full-time operation.

The post is the newest in Oakland county. Mrs. Melvina Elerie of Milford, county GOC supervisor, states the local post should be fully operational since this area, unlike others which have been declared on a standby basis, is still on 24-hour duty since it is near the border and heavily industrial.

Gary Dyla, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Dyla, 878 Brooklawn, Troy, was rushed to Beaumont hospital, Royal Oak, late Friday night, Royal Oak, late Friday night after his mother found him lying face down in his bed.

The mother summoned Troy fire and police officers who worked nearly half an hour in an attempt to revive the child without success.

AN AMBULANCE took him to Beaumont where he was dead on arrival.

Dr. Thomas MacInerney, who examined the boy at Beaumont Saturday, said Gary died of a virus pneumonia which apparently stemmed from a flu ailment.

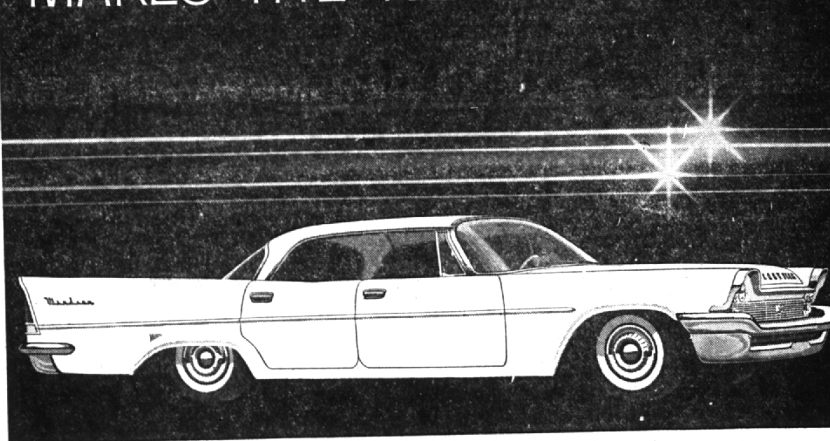

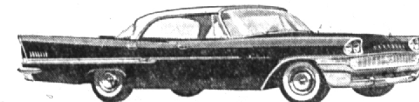
