

Pontiac State Hospital Holds Volunteer Tea

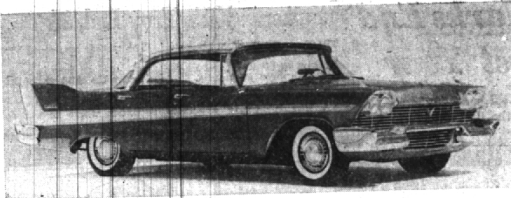

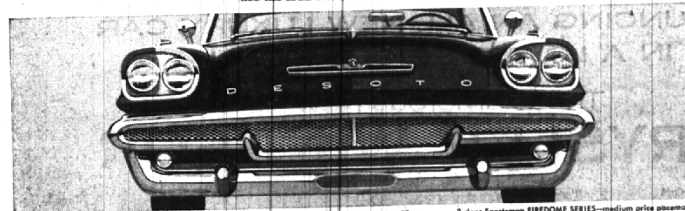
