They will reside in Wisconsin, where the groom will continue studies in Engineering.

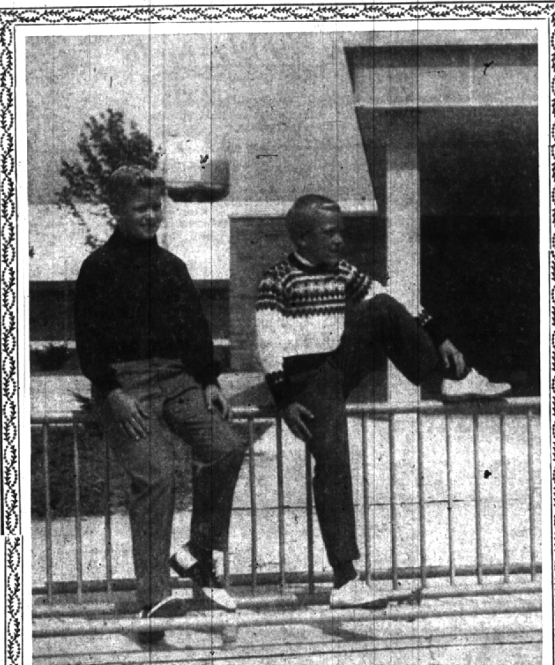
