Potential Sewer Problem Getting B'ham's Study

Birmingham city officials moved ahead this week into studies on two problems in the area north of downtown of Chesterfield streets.

City Manager L. R. Gare looked over the ground where a proposed new sewer outlet would empty into the Rouge River just north of Oak-Lefroy E. Kiefer, 1001 Willow lane, fears present plans would outlet the sewer and deposit sewage on land, resulting in disagreeable sights and odors.

City commissioners agreed they wanted no problem resulting from the project.

KIEFER ALSO raised the question of city enforcement of regulations which prohibit roof downspouts from being connected into sanitary sewers. They are overloading the Oak street sanitary sewer, according to Gare.

Gare said the city would check residences in this particular area, and where such illegal connections were discovered to have them corrected.

The proposed sewer would extend along the Kiefer from Chesterfield. Another sewer in the Quarter area will be constructed along Pine street. Both will relieve flooding of basements west of Chesterfield. They also will serve future lateral street sewers on the north-south streets.

Lower Speed Limits On 3 City Streets

TROY — Traffic regulations were enacted Monday which will mean lower speed limits on three of the city's streets.

Livernois, between Big Beaver and Wattles roads will be 35 mph, as will Wattles between Rochester and Dequindre roads.

Adams road, north of Buckingham to Wimpleton will have a 25 mph speed limit; from Wimpleton to Big Beaver the speed will be set at 35 mph and from Big Beaver to Long Lake road the limit will be 45 mph, according to City Clerk Lawson Lockhart.
