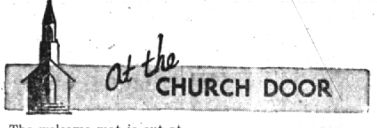

Religious Books Go Home with Worshippers

"Meet me at the book table," has become a happily accepted invitation at Christ Church Cranbrook. There you will find members of the parish, neighbors and visitors from other churches and parishes, becoming acquainted with the books available. Starting two years ago as part of the Christian education program of the church, its purpose was to provide members of the parish and others the opportunity to purchase a wide variety of religious books for reading through the week. At first, the book table was literally one small table and a carton of books, with Mrs. William S. James and Mrs. Lewis C. Keenan in charge. It has grown physically to fill a large area outside the dining room, with four specially designed stalls for book display and storage. As the table has grown in size it has also grown in service to the church and to the community.

BIBLES AND PRAYER books are sold, but also current religious books and the classics of many denominations. Confronted by this large display of books it becomes entirely natural for a book table visitor to ask a committee member "What is this about?" "What book do you suggest on prayer?" Or almost any other subject. Books recommended by the Christ Church Clergy have notations stating the fact. From the beginning, there has been a big demand for children's religious books and there is always a fine selection on hand.
