What Elsie?

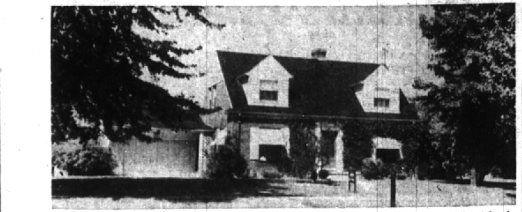
