**Waste Ordinance**

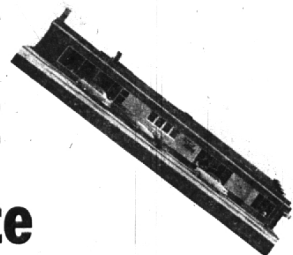
TROY—Ordinance 32, which sets forth rules for rubbish, waste and garbage disposal, was adopted Monday by city commission.

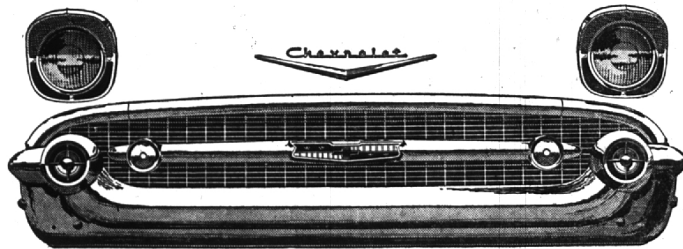
