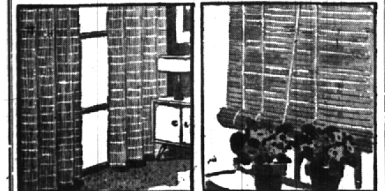

Cars, Lawns Damaged, Thefts Continue

Malicious destruction to automobiles, hub cap thefts, larceny from cars, and driving over lawns were reports that continued to appear on the Birmingham police blotter this week.

Approximately \$200 damage was done to a '57 automobile belonging to a guest at the home of Fred Hendricks, 475 Pilgrim, last Wednesday night. Police said culprits broke glass in the instrument panel, ripped out headlining, and cut plastic seat covers with a knife.

A similar report was received Monday night from Jean Lewis, of Detroit, who said her car top was slashed and seats marked with chalk while it was left parked on Merrill street near Woodward.

A. R. WHITE, 374 Wellesley, reported to police Saturday that a car had driven across his lawn and several neighbors' lawns during the previous night.
