

Police to Crack Down On Football Parking

Acting Bloomfield township police chief Norm Dehnke Monday issued a stern warning to Birmingham high school students that all cars improperly parked in Westchester subdivision during football games will be towed away at the owners' expense.

In addition, Dehnke said stiff fines will be handed out for all parking violations. The Bloomfield police head acted after serious problems resulted during Friday's Birmingham-Cranbrook game.

CARS WERE PARKED on both sides of the subdivision's narrow streets leaving barely enough room for a car to pass. Dehnke said it would have been impossible for a fire truck to get through.

Two cars were towed from in front of fire hydrants. Vehicles were also parked too close to intersections. Dehnke reported that repeated appeals over the public address system resulted in only five drivers moving their cars.

He added that every township officer will be on duty this week at the Bay City Central game to enforce parking regulations in the subdivision.

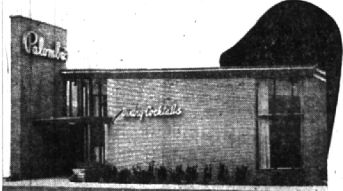
to Sechrist that gave Birmingham a lead it never lost.

Bitchie hit Ed Estes, transfer from East Lansing, in the endzone from seven yards out for the final Maple six-pointer with 1:55 left in the game.



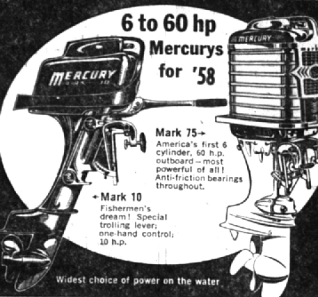
