**SEPTEMBER SALIENTS**

By now you realize the truth of this statement: "Lawn grasses escape drought by becoming dormant and turning brown." You also have seen the lawn begin to "green up" with the fall of the fall rain-falls.

It really is hard to beat nature—so if one gives nature an assist one is in.

If there is a weed problem to be taken care of before you start fertilizing and reseeding program here are a few tips:—

1. Broad leaved weeds are easier to kill now than at any other time of the year.
2. Crabgrass that has not dropped its seeds should be sprayed carefully now with POTASSIUM CYANATE (Carbanol) or SODAR (Disodium Methyl Arsonate).
3. Heavily matted crabgrass is probably best handled by raking so it stands up, mow as short as possible (catch clippings), rake at right angles, mow again, fertilize and seed.

The fertilizers we recommend for fall use in proper order are:—

- WOODRUFF'S GROSSOD (Can sorch)
- AGRICO'S UREAFORM (Non-burning)
- STADLER'S TRIPLE-X (Can sorch)
- AGRICO FOR TURF (Can sorch)

All are 10-6-4 analysis and should be used at a rate of 2 pounds to 100 sq. ft.
