

Ask Courts For Opinion

EAST SOUTHFIELD—Southfield Woods Water Co., Inc., will hold a meeting Monday at 8 p.m. at East Southfield school, 28501 Pierce, to adopt articles of incorporation and elect a board of directors and discuss the company's water supply versus the Southeastern Oakland county water authority's.

Many new members want clarification as to whether present water supply from company wells is adequate for future needs, according to Fred Crona, water board chairman.

THEY HAVE been advised that continuation of present \$3 rate per

users of the present system, according to Crona.

Members have been advised that water costs would increase if purchased through Southfield township.

A LAW FIRM retained by Southfield Woods Water Co. through T. J. Sura reported as follows:

Present lease with the realtors, owning the land on which the new well and pump is situated, expired June 14, 1957.

A request for a two-year option to renew the lease resulted in a letter to the realtors from the Michigan Department of Health

disapproving the renewal.

THE STATE health department said Southfield Woods Water Co. members should secure water through Southfield township which receives part of its water through Southeastern Oakland County Water authority. Health officials also said the company's pumps and wells should be abandoned, Crona stated.

Board members, to insure continued supply of water, authorized their lawyers to institute necessary legal action and an injunction was secured against the realtors in Wayne county circuit court, preventing termination of the lease.

At the same time legal action was started against the commissioner of the State health department in Ingham county circuit court.

THE WATER company's law firm argues that action of the State health department is without authority because they do not show the present water supply is unsafe, Crona noted.

Monthly board of health checks have revealed the water to be well above safety standards, water company officials claim, according to Crona.

The law firm further claims that Michigan law only gives the board of health authority to control pur-

ity of water supply, but not authority to tell home owners where they must obtain their water.

THE WATER board has announced its intention of providing a recreation area for children in the subdivision on the five lots where the wells are now located, when the present water system is discontinued, Crona said.

Because of the importance of an expression from every subdivision member concerning future plans and policies in regard to water systems, all members of Southfield Woods subdivision are urged to attend the meeting, Crona concluded.


