VALLEY WOODS—The Valley Woods branch of the WNFG is sponsoring a sale of double French hybrid lilacs similar to the sale of flowering crab trees offered last spring by the Birmingham branch. The French lilacs offered by the Valley Woods WNFG have been grown by one of the foremost nurseries in the country, being own-root plants, superior to grafted plants. Valley Woods is offering the Edith Cavell lilac, a very showy, creamy white double variety that should be included in every collection; Charles Joly, a double dark red; Montaigne, a soft, al-

most uniform creamy pink and Diver DeBerres, a clear, clean, uniform light blue. Other varieties may be had upon request.

Dennis Foley, son of Mr. and Mrs. Evelyn Foley, hosted a group of neighborhood friends at a get-together party at his home on Vernon drive.


Dennis left last week to start his freshman year at Campion High school at Prairie Du Rocher, Wis., a Jesuit school.
