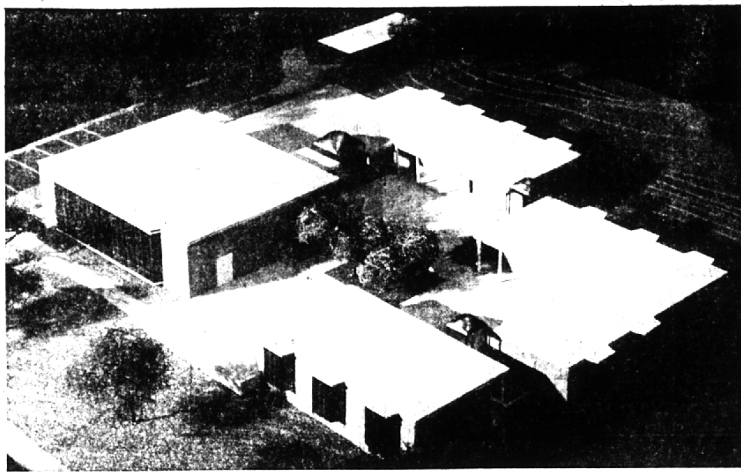

Unitarians Approve Church Design by Yamasaki

Unitarians approved this design for their new church submitted at a congregational meeting recently by Architect Minoru Yamasaki. To be located on an L-shaped lot at Woodward and Lane Pine road, Bloomfield Hills, the church would face on Woodward avenue (at lower left of model in picture). To be built on a campus plan, the structure includes a large social hall (left), and three religious education buildings housing 11 classrooms. Buildings will

surround a garden court. The church hopes to begin work this fall on structures in the model. Later on a sanctuary will be added between the two buildings facing on Woodward. Provision is also made for an additional religious education unit adjoining building at bottom. The structure will contain two offices, kitchen, vestibule, and storage space.

Ganchan at 2245 Northstar, Westwood. It was one of those things that just happen. Mr. Louis Gillette, the church's future minister, was here during a spring holiday from classes at the seminary. He preached at the Maundy Thursday communion services, conducted at the church by the Rev. David Jones.

WHEN THE SERVICE ended, Mr. Gillette stood visiting on the steps with a large group of the church's members.

"Let's go to our house and have some coffee," said Mrs. Ganchan.

It was after midnight when the visiting ended.

Its Christian social relations committee uses it to assist Oakland county public welfare agencies.

Working with the probate court, the committee was instrumental in the development of Camp Oakland for boys and new Ranch House for girls at Oxford.

AT THE STATE hospital, the women not only give parties, but have helped with recreational therapy for the mental patients. The church's women have purchased cedar furniture, pool tables and miniature golf for the patients to enjoy.

The committee also made the first contribution to the newly established Oakland county child education fund. The fund administered by Judge Arthur E. Moore helps deserving, underprivileged children of college caliber through school.

They maintain a huge storehouse of clothing, the "Clothes Closet" at the church. From it garments are given to county welfare agencies when they have emergency calls for clothing.

A family visiting group of Women's auxiliary members calls on needy families.

That's only part of it, but at least it explains why the hat is special.
