

## Girl Smokers Outnumber Boys In Senior Class

"I believe that in this high school there are more girls

than boys who smoke."

That confident statement was recently made by a so-cial studies teacher in Birmingham high. The young ladies in the class took issue. The ensuing discussion led to a survey conducted by the class to determine the facts. Using the medium of unsigned questionnaires, 1311 students were interviewed—with interesting results.

The most significant finding, to me, was that 63% of the senior riple claimed they smoked and 57% of the

the senior girls claimed they smoked and 57°. of the senior boys said they smoked. Most of these girls said they smoked because "it's the thing to do". Most of the boys insisted that they enjoyed it and that was the reason they smoked.

AN OBJECTIVE observer, however, might ponder both of these reasons and wonder if the young folks really know why they are smoking at such a "tender

age: Could it be the results of a lengthy, intensive and in-credibly expensive advertising campaign? None of the youngsters, and not many adults, can recall the days when a lady was of very sad repute indeed if she was ever seen smoking a cigarette. There was a day, also, when no gentleman would smoke a cigarette beauch that would immediately classify him with the pool hall and subon crowd. and saloon crowd.

IN THE 1920'S, however, a great campaign was started to bring about social acceptance of cigarettes. Immediately, advertisers placed cigarettes in the hands

and between the lips of well dressed, usually young, men.

Soon they began to place a lady in the picture who was not at all horrified to find this nice looking man smoking in her presence. Then the lady was moved closer

and seemed to admire this fine young man's smoking.

The next step was drastic—to get the young lady also smoking. A genuis was at work, and he came up with, "Reach for a Lucky instead of a sweet." It worked.

SMOKE AND stay slender! Eat sweets and be obeses! The lady, young and beautiful, was now actually smoking and for such a good reason, too!
