Beverly Hills Baptist Sets Moving Day

WESTWOOD—A big day looms ahead for members of the congregation of Beverly Hills Baptist church. It will come May 4 or May 11, when they expect to move from the tiny frame structure they occupy on Greenfield road near E. 11 Mile.

Came May, the congregation will hold its first services in its new church structure, now being completed on 13 Mile road near Greenfield school.

Rev. Roy A. Pitts, minister of the church, said they plan to hold dedication services Sunday, June 8. The new building is the first unit of three planned on the four-acre site of the church. Costing about \$100,000, the structure will seat approximately 240 in its sanctuary, and also house the church school classroom.

St. Bede's To Be Dedicated By Cardinal Next Thursday

SOUTHFIELD—His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, Archbishop of Detroit, will dedicate Saint Bede's Catholic church and school, 12 Mile at Southfield, next Thursday, April 24, at 8 p.m.

The parish was established by the Rev. Cyril J. Keating in June, 1954. The contemporary church structure was erected and mass celebrated for the first time on Easter Sunday, 1956. The six-classroom school building, housing 120 children in grades from one through three, was opened in September, 1957, and is staffed by the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

ASSISTING in ceremonies next Thursday will be the Rev. Lucian Roberts, pastor of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs church, Birmingham. Other Detroit area pastors participating as major ministers will be Rev. Charles T. Walsh, Rev. Frederick Delaney, Rev. William Lynch, and Rev. Clair Berry. Dedication speaker will be the Rev. Arthur Beckinger, of St. Anselm's church, Dearborn, a classmate of Fr. Keating's.

St. Bede's parish began with 240 and now has a membership of 500 families. It is one of five parishes sponsoring Central Catholic high school, to be built on Lahser near 14 Mile Road.

THE CHURCH SEATING approximately 700, plans eventual construction of a permanent church, a parsonage, convent and school addition on its 12-acre site. About 50 per cent of St. Bede's parishioners are "Latin" residents of the Federal Correction institution, at Leavenworth, Kan.

Fr. Keating, St. Bede's pastor, was for eight years chaplain at the Federal Correction institution, at Leavenworth, Kan. He has first assignment was with the Rev. Charles Coughlin at Shrine of the Little Flower, Royal Oak.

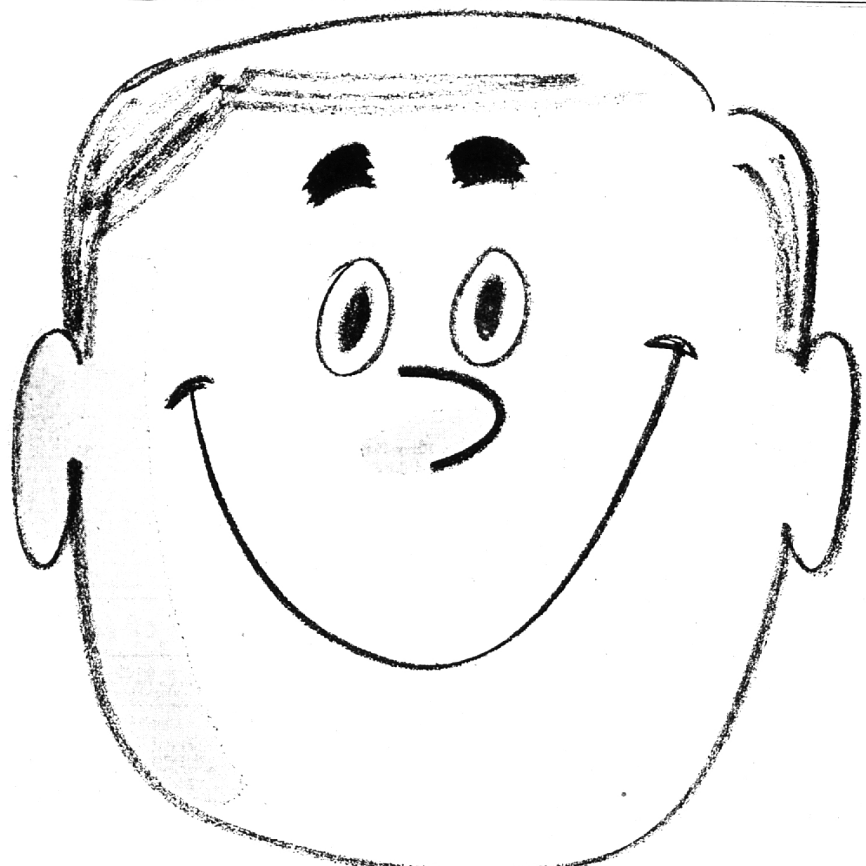
