Altrusa Initiates Two New Members

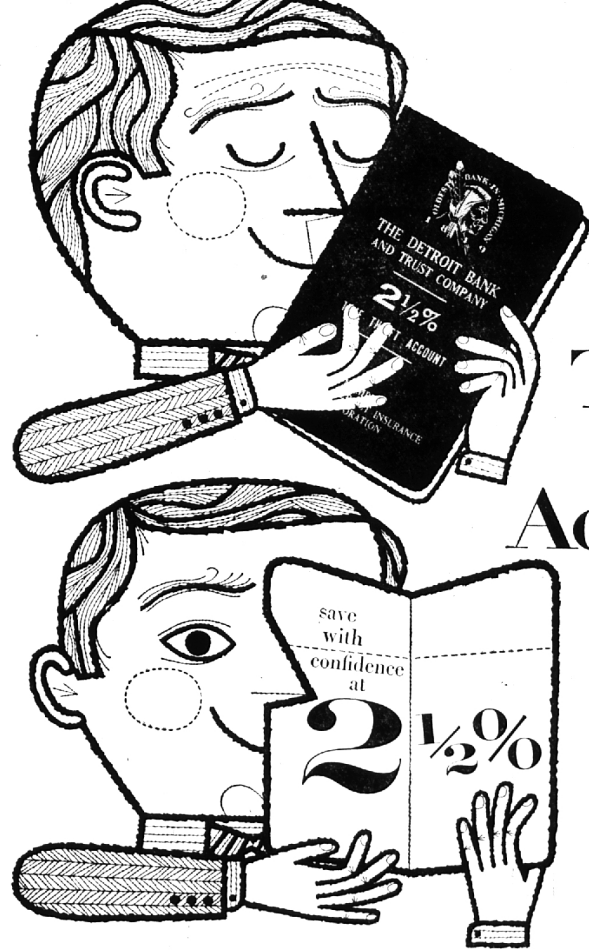
