The Spring concert will be held April 19 at 8:29 p.m. in the Detroit Institute of Arts auditorium. Wayne Dunlap will be the guest conductor, and Emily Martin Adams, violinist, is the soloist. Dunlap has been the conductor of the University orchestra and the opera workshop at the University of Michigan, also the Grosse Pointe Symphony. 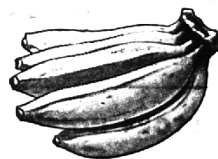
