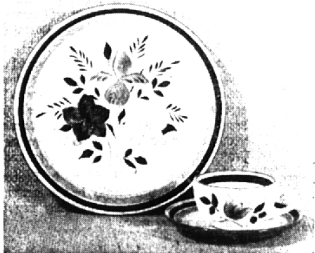


## Redeemer Lutheran Mother-Daughter Banquet Scheduled

"Quite churchly," says Rev. John A. Root of the house chapel newly occupied by the congregation of St. Andrew's Lutheran church, on Telegraph road just north of Maple. Here he stands before the altar behind which is draped a wine-colored dossal cloth. Completed in January, the chapel will be dedicated Sunday at 2 p.m. when the Rev. Dr. Frank P. Madsen, president of the Michigan synod of the United Lutheran

church, will be speaker. An open house follows at 4 p.m. Approximately 110 persons attend 11 a.m. Sunday services weekly in the little chapel, while about 75 children attend the 9:30 a.m. session of the basement church school. The structure will eventually become a three-bedroom parsonage after a church is built on the nine-acre lot. The church will face on Telegraph road.

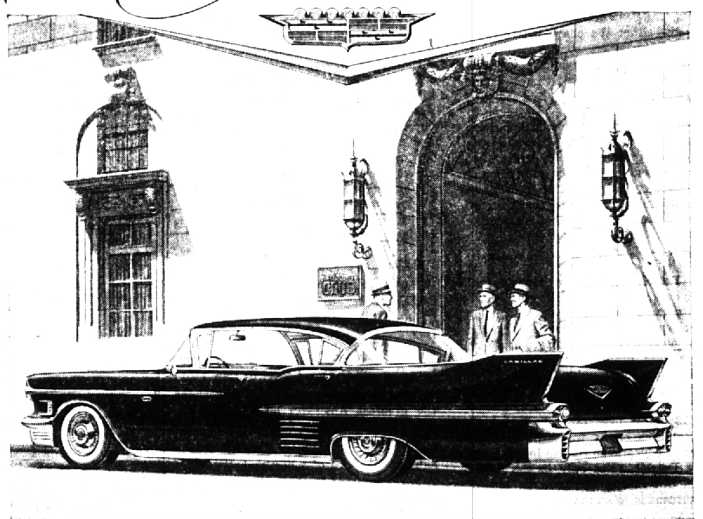

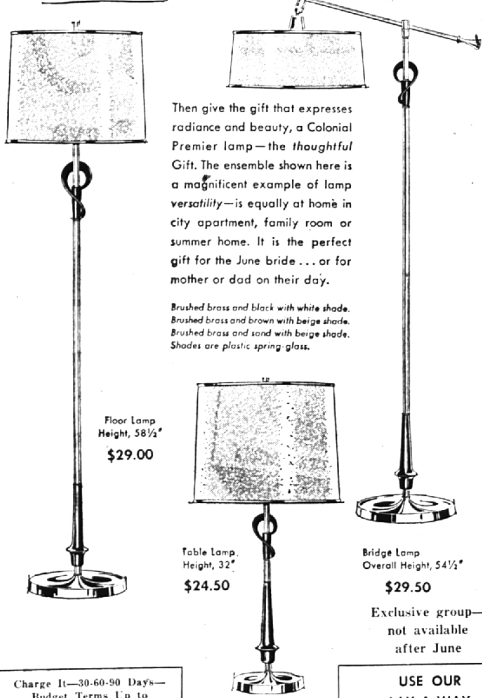
