Whether you agree with them or not, can anyone deny the sound Christian thinking behind the trip four men are making to protest further atom testing?

Rev. Dr. Emil Koltz, of first Baptist church, told us about the four men when we sat across from him at a luncheon recently.

When we expressed an interest in it, Dr. Koltz gave us a reprint of an article about their daring project.

**TWO WELL-EDUCATED** men, leaders in their Quaker churches in New England, organized the sailboat trip to Eniwetok island in the Pacific.

There they plan to remain during the period announced for the spring test explosions of American nuclear weapons. We read the statement of one of the men, Albert S. Bigelow, of Cox Col., Conn.

"It is not utter blasphemy," reasons this man as he discusses nuclear bombing of cities, "to think that there is anything moral or Christian about such behavior."

He plans a similar project, Bigelow explains, to carry the same message to people and authorities in Russia.

**BIGELOW TELLS** how he went to Washington carrying petitions with 27,000 signatures protesting further nuclear tests as suicidal military preparation.

He was unable to get an audience in Washington with anyone of influence.

Then, he decided, he must find ways to "make our witness and protest heard."

"When you see something horrible happening," says Bigelow, "... you can even talk yourself into saying that it isn't horrible. I can't do that. I have to act."

Whether Bigelow and his crew carry out their plans or not, you can't help admiring their thinking.

At Eastertime when our thoughts are on the Prince of Peace, this reporter admires a man who translates His teachings into action.

# Easter Sunday Worship Services To Draw Thousands into Churches

To celebrate the triumph of Easter, choirs have prepared special music, extra services are scheduled by many churches, and one church plans its annual sunrise service for the young people.

Catholics will begin an Easter vigil service at 11 p.m. Saturday at Holy Name church, with a solemn high mass to be celebrated at midnight. The men's and boys' choir, under direction of John F. Callaghan, will sing.

On Easter Sunday, Holy Name church will observe its regular schedule of Sunday masses, with the Ladies' choir singing at the 10 a.m. high mass. A special schedule for hearing of confessions has been arranged for Saturday, with hours from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and 7:30 to 9 p.m.

**ST. JAMES** Episcopal church will mark Easter with a holy baptism service at 4:30 p.m. Easter even. Holy communion will be celebrated at 7 a.m., when the junior choir will sing, and again at 9 and 11:15 a.m.

**FIRST BAPTIST** church begins its celebration with an outdoor sunrise service by the young people at waterfall park on W. Maple

at 8:30 a.m. Sunday school service, by the Rev. Theo. Waggazer, "The Man Who Experienced Easter." The Rev. Werner Kuntz will preach at the 9:30 a.m. Sunday school service.

**EMORY METHODIST** church will hold Easter morning services at 8:30, 10 and 11:15 a.m., when the Rev. Rosamund B. Becker will preach on "The Life Eternal." Victor Ulrich will be soloist at all three services. The junior choir sings at 8:30 and the senior choir at 10, to be joined by the carol choir at 11:15.

**BIRMINGHAM CONGREGATIONAL** church's young people will join those of two Detroit congregational churches at a 5:30 a.m. sunrise service in Palmer Park and breakfast after.

On Easter morning, the Rev. Robert D. Dosey will preach on "Resurrection" at 9:30 and 11 a.m., in which the children's choir will participate.

**FRANKLIN COMMUNITY** church's senior high youth fellowship will also sponsor a 6:30 a.m. sunrise service, followed by a 7:30 a.m. breakfast.

Duplicate services will be held at the church at 9:30 and 11 a.m. with a sermon by the Rev. Robert J. Seals on "I Believe in Life Everlasting."

**EPISCOPAL CHURCH** of the Advent will hold a service of holy communion at 8 a.m. Easter morning, with a festive holy communion service at 9:15 and 11:15 a.m. at W. Long Lake road at Midvale.

**CHRIST CHURCH CRANBROOK** will hold a sunrise holy

communion service at 6:30 a.m. in the Chapel of the Resurrection. Holy communion in the church will be at 8 a.m., with festive holy communion and sermon at both 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.

**NORTHWESTERN BAPTIST** church will hold an Easter pageant at 10 a.m., when the sermon subject will be "Easter Triumph," at 19421 W. 10 Mile road.

**LUTHERAN CHURCH** of the Shepherd-King will hold a sunrise service at its permanent church site, W. Maple road and Middlebelt, at 5:55 Easter morning. An altar will be erected under the great walnut tree, and a field organ will provide music. Preacher will be Rev. Alvin Scheips, student chaplain at the University of Michigan.

A second festival service will be held at Eagle school, 14 Mile and Middlebelt, at 10:30 a.m., with the Rev. A. Karl Boehmke preaching on "Look the Stone Is Rolled Away."

**FIRST METHODIST** church will hold a special baptism service at 3 p.m. Easter Sunday. These morning worship services will be at 8, 9:30 and 11 a.m.

**GRAVE BAPTIST** church will hold their Easter services at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m., with a special musical program and a resurrection film "He Lives," at the evening service. Rev. Charles Whitfield will preach on "Resurrection" at the morning service.
