Grants Being Offered For Graduate Study

Birmingham branch of the American Association of University Women is proud to announce that the \$2,000.00 profit from their 1957 Book Sale will be used nationally and locally for education fellowships and grants.

Prior to this year all the educational fellowships and grants had been given on a national basis. This year for the first time two grants are being offered for graduate study to local women teachers.

TWO \$500.00 grants for 1958 summer study are being offered to any woman who has taught 5 years and is now teaching in the public secondary schools of the Birmingham or Bloomfield school districts, or is a member of the Birmingham branch of AAUW accredited college or university, the courses to be in content only.

A typewritten letter stating name, previous training, field of specialization, school at which she is teaching, courses she wishes to take, the college or university at which she will study, and how she feels this would benefit her as a teacher, should be sent before April 15 to Mrs. Marvin Marsh, 1604 Beechwood, Birmingham.

Applicants will be interviewed and selected by a committee of 5 comprising Dr. M. H. Cress, assistant Supt. in charge of personnel; Eugene Johnson, Supt. of schools; Bloomfield; Mrs. Preston Weir, chairman AAUW fellowship program.
